Tabor City Catches The Matthew 25 Center Vision

A group of people has caught the vision of replicating The Matthew 25 Center near the new state prison set to open in Tabor City, NC this fall. Burnett Coleman, a retired banker in Tabor City, first heard about The Matthew 25 Center from Pete Cowan, Mayor of Burgaw, at a planning meeting of local government officials. He was impressed with the idea and began to consider the possibility of implementing such a ministry in his community. He began to share his vision with people in the Tabor City area and soon had a core group who also shared his desire to see it become a reality.

The group began to explore the possibility and formulate a plan. They sent a delegation to Burgaw to tour the Center and to sit down with representatives of the Board of Directors in Burgaw to gather more information. Impressed with what they saw, the group resolved to move forward with the project. They scheduled a planning meeting on March 27, 2008 in Tabor City and formed an ‘exploratory committee’ to flesh out the idea. As more people heard of the idea, excitement grew among those involved. A public information meeting was scheduled for June 19 and drew approximately 50 people.

The group has formally constituted as “The Matthew 25 Center at Tabor City, Inc.” and is actively working to bring the dream to reality as rapidly as possible. The group has been given a 2 acre tract of land near the entrance to the new prison for the new Center.

Hopefully, some day there will be places like The Matthew 25 Center in locations across the state to assist inmate families who have been so adversely affected by the incarceration of a family member, and to minister to some of their most critical needs in Christ’s name.
