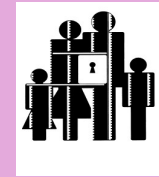

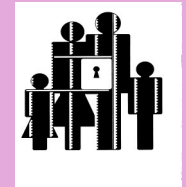

From the Desk of the Directors

Our design for this newsletter is highlighted with the liturgical color for Advent, a period in which we await the coming of the Christ Child and a period in which we slow down and reflect on the past and anticipate what the future may hold.



And what an exciting and fantastic year we have had at The Matthew 25 Center. From hosting various ministries such as Kairos, Families in Crisis, and Rock of Ages to welcoming our many guests, ministering to the families of the incarcerated and indirectly to the residents of Pender Correctional Institution highlights our ecumenical response to the social justice challenge offered by Jesus in his final parable from the Gospel of Matthew.

So what does the future hold? As noted in a previous section, we have been successful in meeting our fundraising goal for 2011. While it would be good to “rest on our laurels” and take a deep breath, the need to push forward to achieve even greater goals is paramount for the Matthew 25 Center to continue in its successes. If you take a look at our Christmas Wish List, it is evident that our facility is in need of repairs and updating to meet environmental, public awareness, and public safety guidelines. And to achieve all of this, of course, will require a financial commitment which can only be met through the efforts of our dedicated patrons, the ecumenical community at large, our guests, and the “blood, sweat, and tears” of our many volunteers. To achieve the items on our wish list, our new fundraising goal for 2012/2013 has been set at \$116,000. We will be introducing the Sugar Bowl 365 Campaign in early 2012 where by we will be asking individuals, churches, and businesses to consider pledging anywhere from \$1 to \$5 per day for 365 days to The Matthew 25 Center. Or more simply put to set aside those amounts and place it in your “sugar bowls” for use on a rainy day like Grandma used to do it. So look forward to an announcement of this fundraising effort coming to you in the mail.

Before we begin the Sugar Bowl 365 Campaign, we are excited also to announce that we will be launching our new Matthew 25 Center website after the first of the new year. Our new enhanced website will be bold in appearance and will offer our patronage a vehicle to make donations in an on-line venue. Additionally the ability of our guests to make on-line reservations will be enhanced and with improvements in our webhosting, we will have a greater presence on the world wide web making it easier to be located during on-line searches for hospitality centers for families of the incarcerated such as The Matthew 25 Center.

Good News!..the Community Resource Council for the Pender Correctional Institution reports the Chapel Project has been approved by the State and now awaits the signing of the lease. Once the lease is in hand, a groundbreaking will be scheduled and then construction can commence.

As this year draws to a close, Judi and I would like to thank each and everyone of you for your thoughts, prayers, words of encouragement, and financial support during 2011. We have enjoyed working for you and hope to become acquainted with more of you as time goes on.....so come by for a cup of coffee and sit a spell.....
