### One Day with God Camp

On April 25, The Matthew 25 Center partnered with Forgiven Ministry of Taylorsville, NC to hold the fourth annual One Day with God Camp at Pender CI. Fifty four children of inmate fathers had the opportunity to spend a day with their fathers at the prison. They played games, had a cookout, decorated a birdhouse, were entertained by a clown troupe, but most of all had time to spend getting to know each other. Some of the fathers had never seen their children except across a visitation room table. Some of the



fathers had never even seen their children. "This is one of the very best things that we do at the prison all year," said Jim Spiritosanto, Chaplain at Pender CI.
