## Pender CI Chapel Project Update

Work on the Pender Correctional Institution Chapel is progressing well. After years of planning and fund raising and enduring frustrating delays awaiting approval by various governmental agencies, construction on the chapel at Pender Correctional Institution began on October 15, 2012. The building has been framed and the brick facade applied. The roof will be installed in June. The plumber, electrician and heat and air installer have completed their respective rough-ins and Standard Glass of Wilmington is finalizing the installation of the large window in the worship area. When these items are complete and inspected, we will be able to install insulation and sheet rock. If we do not encounter any unexpected delays, the building could be complete by the end of the summer.

A cooperative venture between NC Baptist Men and the Pender CI Community Resource Council, the project will provide much needed space for the 768 inmates at the prison. The 4,200 sq. ft. building will provide a 216 seat auditorium, two classrooms, two chaplains' offices, a clerk's office and work room, restrooms and storage space. The building will allow all the religious activities to be housed under one roof and to function in space specifically designed to promote worship.

The work is progressing well, but much work still needs to be done. While most of the work has been done by men from south eastern NC, we have had significant help from teams from across the state. In the

coming weeks we will need painters, finish carpenters, ceramic tile installers, carpet installers and other skills. If you would like to help with this project, please contact:

It meant the world to her.
